
Fownhope New Memorial Hall (FNMH)


The Hall is one of the principal meeting and social centres for the Fownhope area and is managed by a team of eight Trustees/Officers, elected annually by Hall users at the AGM held in March. There is a large main hall for up to 150 people. The ceiling of

this is normally at 5m, but can be raised for events, such as badminton, that require more height. We also have a bar and a kitchen plus a small upstairs meeting room (The Tesco Room), which can seat about 30. Other facilities include: a sound system with hearing loop, projector, modular staging, stage lighting, versatile house lighting and storage facilities. The Hall holds both PPL and PRS licences.

insurance. Members were helped by the trustees of the society in times of hardship or illness. Each year members would celebrate with a Club Walk on Oak Apple Day, parading through Fownhope carrying sticks decorated with flowers and following a decorated oak bough.

The current **Fownhope Heart of Oak Society** began in 1989 when the financial aspects of the older society were wound up as legal requirements became too onerous. Its aim is to preserve the long tradition of the Club Walk Parade in Fownhope and in doing so, foster community spirit and family links. 

Bus Passes

Herefordshire residents who have reached the qualifying age* and many disabled people are entitled to an English National Concessionary Bus Travel Pass from Herefordshire County Council. This pass allows:

• Free local bus travel in Herefordshire between 9.30am to 11pm Monday to Friday and at all times on Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holidays

- Free local bus travel anywhere else in England between 9.30am to 11pm Monday to Friday and at all times on Saturday, Sunday and bank holidays
- Free local bus travel between 9.30am to 11pm Monday to Friday and at all times on Saturday, Sunday and bank holidays, between Herefordshire and places in Wales, provided that each bus journey starts or finishes in Herefordshire, or is between Presteigne and Knighton in Powys

The bus pass is free but if you lose your pass you will need to pay £10 for a replacement.

*The qualifying age for an Older Person's Bus Pass is the same as the current female state pension age, whether you are a man or a woman.

These are provided monthly by Fownhope and Mordiford Parish Councils, each £3.70 return, free to pass-holders.


